# 4. Affordable and Accessible Transportation Community Engagement Project Update

Project Team: Russell Dyson, Tanis Dagert, and Adriane Schroeder Laurel Sliskovic, the researcher hired by the ACHN/ACRD provided an update on Transportation Consultation.

Phase 1 - Literature Review was completed in November 2013.

Phase 2 - Stakeholder Interviews are being conducted: 24 out the contracted 30 interviews have been completed. Currently are in the preliminary stages of analysis, trying to understand the current situation, asking people of the awareness of the programs, looking for understanding of coordinated efforts.

Phase 3 Social Media Campaign will be launched at the end of January via the health network facebook site, press releases, newspaper articles on what the transportation landscape looks like. Community Engagements will take place in February in Port Alberni, Bamfield, Ucluelet and Tofino. Final analysis will take place over March.
